Grand Council of Royal and Select Masons of Ohio - Resource Course Items

**THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE FOUND IN THE CODE OF THE GRAND COUNCIL
OF ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS OF THE STATE OF OHIO - CONSTITUTION
SECTION**

1. Whereas this Grand Council recognizes the ancient usage's and landmarks of Freemasonry and the _____ of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Ohio; that the degrees of the Cryptic Rite are complementary to and explanatory of the Symbolic degrees and the Royal Arch Degree;
2. No members of the Grand Council except the first _____ officers of Constituent Councils may be represented by proxy.
3. This Grand Council shall not, except for the performance of ceremonial duties, be opened, nor shall business be transacted therein, unless there be present duly accredited representatives from at least _____ of the Chartered Councils; but a smaller number may meet and adjourn from day to day until a constitutional quorum shall be present.
4. Each member of this Grand Council shall be entitled to _____ in his own right, and no more, _____ he holds the proxy of one or more of the first three officers or shall have been designated as the representative of a Constituent Council.
5. No Companion shall be eligible to office in this Grand Council, except the _____, unless he shall have been elected and installed and have presided as Master of a Council of Royal and Select Masons.
6. Vacancies in Grand offices shall be filled by the _____ until the next Annual Grand Assembly.
7. The Grand Master or his proxy, or any Companion having attained the rank of _____ of a Constituent Council, shall be competent to act as Installing Officer to install any Grand Officer or officer of a Constituent Council, when in the line of his duty, or when properly requested so to do.
8. Any objection to the installation of a Grand Officer-elect must be stated in a _____ with the reason therefore, but unless such objection is sustained by a majority of the members present and eligible to vote, the installation shall proceed.
9. All degrees shall be conferred at least _____ in each fiscal year by each Constituent Council in the Jurisdiction.
10. A Constituent Council shall consist of not fewer than _____ Royal and Select Masters.

11. Every Constituent Council shall be represented at each Annual Grand Assembly of the Grand Council by its _____, _____, _____, _____ or their proxies.

12. Every petitioner for the degrees of Royal and Select Master, or for membership by affiliation in a Constituent Council, shall be a member in good standing in both a legal Lodge of Master Masons and a legal _____.

13. A Council may receive and act upon the petition of a Master Mason in good standing who has regularly petitioned a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, but _____ the Council degrees upon said petitioner unless he shall have received within six months from the date of his Council petition the Royal Arch degrees.

14. A Council may confer the distinction of _____ upon any Royal and Select Master, not a member of such Council, who has rendered long and eminent service to Cryptic Freemasonry.

15. Honorary membership does not confer the right to vote or _____ and there shall be no obligation to pay dues.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE FOUND IN THE CODE OF THE GRAND COUNCIL OF ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS OF THE STATE OF OHIO - RULES OF ORDER SECTION

16. During the hours of business the members are required to keep their seats and observe strict order and decorum, and no member shall leave the hall without permission, or absent himself from the service of the Grand Council, unless he _____, or be sick and unable to attend.

17. No member shall speak more than _____ upon the same question, unless it be to explain, without permission of the Grand Master.

18. When the Grand Master or presiding officer _____, all debate shall cease, and silence shall be observed. When the previous question has been moved and ordered, all further _____ debate or amendment shall be precluded.

19. No motion shall be entertained until it is _____, and no debate shall be had thereon until it is stated by the chair.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE FOUND IN THE CODE OF THE GRAND COUNCIL OF
ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS OF THE STATE OF-OHIO - BY-LAWS SECTION

20. Persons desiring to be heard on matters coming before any committee shall appear before such committee. at such time and place as the _____ of the particular committee shall direct.
21. The duties of such Grand Representatives shall be to exchange _____ and information and to promote harmony and proper fraternal relations between the Grand Councils.
22. The Master and Recorder shall furnish every needed information and assistance to the Inspector in the performance of his _____.
23. The Grand Master shall appoint an Illustrious Companion of proven ability and dedication who is recommended by the Inspector of each Arch to serve under the direct supervision and authority of that Arch Inspector as _____.
24. The appointment shall be for _____ year only with no assurance of further appointment or election to office. A Companion may serve a maximum of _____ years as an Adjutant.
25. The Master, Deputy Master and Principal Conductor of the Work of a Constituent Council may each appoint a member of his Council as his _____ to the Grand Council.
26. Thirty cents per mile, and no more, for each mile traveled going thereto, to be estimated by the nearest and most direct traveled automobile route from the location of _____.
27. The fiscal year of this Grand Council shall begin on _____ and close with the following _____.
28. The Recorder of each Constituent Council shall make full annual returns to the _____ upon the form provided by the Grand Recorder.
29. A late filing fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be assessed a Council which fails to file its annual report in the Grand Council office _____.
30. The Recorder of each Council shall, _____ after making the annual returns to the Grand Council, spread a true copy thereof, excepting the "List of All Members," upon the minutes of the Council, or shall retain and preserve a full and complete copy thereof in a permanent form prescribed by the Grand Recorder.

31. Each Constituent Council, whether Chartered or under Dispensation, shall pay annually to this Grand Council for each advancement made therein during the preceding fiscal year of this Grand Council, ending May 31st ultimo, the sum of _____ as Grand fees, which amount may, in the discretion of the Council, be added to the fee for advancement.

32. Constituent Councils shall not be required to pay Grand dues on members who are eligible for the Ohio Grand Council Fifty-Year emblem prior to _____.

33. Constituent Councils _____ be liable for Grand dues of Companions restored to membership after expulsion, suspension or dropping from the rolls for any year in which such Council did not charge or receive dues from such restored member.

34. Constituent Councils shall fix by their By-Laws the fee for advancement to the Royal and Select Master Degrees, which fee shall not be less than _____ and shall in all cases accompany the petition.

35. The fee for the degrees may in no case be _____ or donated by the Council.

36. _____ may be charged for the honorary degree of Super Excellent Master.

37. The By-Laws of each Council shall designate the amount of dues so assessed, which shall not be less than _____, and the time for payment thereof shall be at the Annual Stated Assembly in June of each year, which shall be sufficient notice to each member.

38. Dues shall be payable _____.

39. It shall be the imperative duty of the Master at a Stated Assembly to cause the Recorder to enter as "Suspended" every member who is in arrears for dues for _____ after the time fixed in the By-Laws of Council for payment.

40. If the dues of such suspended member are not paid or remitted within _____ months _____, it shall be the imperative duty of the Master to cause the Recorder to enter such suspended member as "Indefinitely Suspended for Non Payment of Dues."

41. A Constituent Council shall not assess annual dues against a member while he is under sentence of either expulsion or _____.

42. Fifty-year members who were eligible to receive the Grand Council fifty-year emblem prior to June 1, 1997, may not be assessed _____, although they may voluntarily submit the annual dues of the Council.

43 . If the holder of Life Membership transfers to another Council within this Jurisdiction, the Grand Council Finance Committee shall transfer on the record, the remaining fees received for Life Membership to his new Council providing the dues of the affiliated body are the same. If more, the Life Member _____ the additional amount according to the current formula to remain a Life Member in his new Council.

44. In the event the Fund Committee finds it necessary to revise the existing formula, such revisions _____ to the current Life Member or be retroactive.

45. The apron is _____ worn by either the officers or workers in the degree work of the several degrees when in costume, except it shall be provided otherwise in the ritual.

46. To each Constituent Council _____ copies of the ritual of the degrees of Royal and Select Master and _____ copies of the ritual of the degree of Super Excellent Master. Each of said rituals shall be given into the custody of the Recorder of each Constituent Council, who shall immediately file a receipt therefore with the Grand Recorder.

47. The use of Personal Degree Monitors is permitted providing the Personal Degree Monitor is printed and purchased from the Grand Council office for the sum of \$10.00 each through the _____.

48. Each _____ of a Constituent Council shall be responsible during his term of office for the safekeeping of the ritual books given into his custody. As the Master may direct, the Recorder shall loan such rituals to the officers and degree workers of the Council. For each ritual so issued, the Recorder shall take a "Receipt for Temporary Loan of Ritual," which forms are supplied without charge from the office of the Grand Recorder.

49. It shall be the duty of the _____ to see that all amendments to the rituals are securely attached in their proper places in the ritual books.

50. All rituals shall be _____ to the Inspecting Officer at each annual inspection.

51. No officer shall loan any ritual to any other officer or Companion without first securing a _____ upon the form provided for temporary loans, which shall also bear the written approval of the Master.

52. Any Grand Officer, Past Grand Master, Past Deputy Grand Master, Past Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, Inspector of Constituent Councils, Master of a Constituent Council, or any other officer or Companion of a Constituent Council who shall have received from this Grand Council an officer of the Grand Council of a Constituent Council, one or more copies of the rituals of the several degrees and shall have lost the same, or shall withhold or fail to return the same or any of them to the Grand Council when called for, shall forfeit and pay to this Grand Council the sum of _____ per copy.

53. No Constituent Council shall receive instruction in the rituals except from its own members or from the Grand Officers or _____ appointed by authority of this Grand Council.

54. The _____ of each Council is responsible for the proper instruction of all officers of his Council in the rituals of the several degrees, and he is accountable to the Grand Council for the enforcement of strict conformity to the authorized rituals at all times.

55. The Royal Master, the Select Master and the Super Excellent Master Degrees must be conferred or exemplified in accordance with the rituals herein authorized by each Constituent Council at least _____ in each fiscal year and by each Council under Dispensation at least once before such Council shall be eligible to receive a Charter.

56. Not less than _____ Royal and Select Masters, in good standing, desiring to form and organize a new Council under Dispensation, may unite in a petition to either the Grand Councilor the Grand Master, praying for permission and a Dispensation so to do, and such petition shall be in the form prescribed by this Grand Council, and shall, with all other necessary blanks, be furnished by the Grand Recorder.

57. No Constituent Council within this Jurisdiction shall become a _____.

58. The officers of this Council shall be a Master, Deputy Master, Principal Conductor of the Work, Treasurer, Recorder, Captain of the Guard, Conductor of Council, Steward and Sentinel. They shall be elected and shall be installed at the first Stated Assembly in _____ or within one hundred days following.

59. Each Master, when installed, shall appoint a Committee on Finance consisting of _____ members of this Council, to serve for the year. It is the duty of this committee to examine and report upon all bills and demands presented to this Council for payment.

60. Each Master, when installed, shall appoint a Committee on _____, consisting of three members, whose duty it shall be to assist the Recorder in the collection of dues of delinquent members, personally interviewing such members, not merely curtly demanding payment, but urging attendance and activity and showing to the delinquent that his absence is regretted more than his delay of payment. The Committee shall also inquire into the reasons for which members are asking demits.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE FOUND IN THE CODE OF THE GRAND COUNCIL OF
ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS OF THE STATE OF OHIO - REGULATIONS SECTION

61 . Each Constituent Council in this Grand Jurisdiction shall be required to keep and preserve its Charter or Dispensation in a safe place within its reach and control, and no Constituent Council shall be permitted to open or close its Assemblies for any purpose whatever without such Charter or Dispensation or a _____ thereof being prominently displayed in the Council Hall.

62 . _____ members of the Council, one of whom is qualified to preside, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

63 . _____ are those called by vote of the Council, or by the Master at a Stated Assembly, or at his discretion in the interim, upon the giving of due and timely notice to all members of the Council of the time of the holding of such Special Assembly and the business to be transacted thereat.

64. The business for which a Special Assembly is called shall be stated in the call, and _____ shall be transacted at such Special Assembly.

65. Each Council shall provide in its By-Laws for at least _____ Stated Assembly in each calendar month. The Master, in his discretion, may dispense with the Stated Assemblies in July and August.

66. No Companion shall be eligible to the office of Illustrious Master of a Constituent Council unless he has been elected and served as _____ in some Chartered Council, or has been appointed by the Grand Councilor Grand Master as Deputy Master or Principal Conductor of the Work, and has served in such capacity in some Council Under Dispensation.

67. The officers of Constituent Councils shall be chosen annually, by ballot at the first Stated Assembly in _____. A majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary to elect.

68. The annual meeting of each Constituent Council shall be the first Stated Assembly in _____ and the installation of officers shall not be held before that date.

69. The Recorder shall file in the Grand Council office a certificate of election of officers, as provided by the Grand Recorder, within _____ days of such election.

70. Neither the Master, Deputy Master nor Principal Conductor of the Work may _____ during their respective terms in office except for reasons satisfactory to and with the consent of the Council and Grand Master, and no other officer may resign during his term in office except for reasons satisfactory to and with the consent of the Council.

71. No officer may _____ while in office or become a petitioner for a new Council except for reasons satisfactory to and with the consent of the Council and Grand Master.

72. Officers of Constituent Councils shall be installed at the first Stated Assembly in _____, or within one hundred days thereafter.

73. The officers of a Council must be _____ at a tiled Assembly of the Council or, with the consent of the Council, at an Assembly to which guests who are not Select Masters may be invited.

74. Guests who are not Select Masters _____ participate in any manner in the ceremony of installation.

75. Any _____ shall be competent to install the officers of a Constituent Council when in the line of his duty, or when properly requested to do so.

76. All officers, when installed, shall retain their respective offices until their successors have been duly _____.

77. No officer may be installed until the Recorder shall have certified, under seal of the Council, that he has received the degree of _____. Such certificate shall be spread in full upon the minutes and transmitted to the Grand Recorder.

78. The Illustrious Master of each Constituent Council shall _____ at all its sessions, _____ the transaction of its business and the conferring of degrees, determine its order of business, supervise and direct the work of its officers, decide questions of Masonic law and procedure, have charge of the Dispensation or Charter, attend all Grand Assemblies of the Grand Council in person or by proxy, appoint, unless otherwise provided, all committees, and to do, in conformity with Masonic law and usage, all things necessary for the proper government of the Council over which he presides.

79. His decisions are _____ to the Council or to discussion unless with his consent or permission.

80. He may, when present and responsible therefore, permit _____ Companion to preside or to confer degrees.

81. In his absence, the _____ or in his absence, the Principal Conductor of the Work, shall preside.

82. He may for cause be suspended or removed from office by the _____ or the Grand Council, but not by, nor may charges be preferred against him, in a Constituent Council.

83. When an amendment to a By-Law is adopted by a Constituent Council, the Recorder shall submit in triplicate to the Grand Recorder a true copy thereof, with a certificate under seal of the Council showing date of submission, that due notice was given to members, that it lay over until the next Stated or later Assembly, date of adoption, and that it received the affirmative vote of _____ or more of those present and entitled to vote.

84. No Constituent Council shall confer the degrees for a _____ than the amount fixed by its By-Laws for conferring same, which shall not be less than the minimum prescribed in the By-Laws of this Grand Council. The fee must in all cases accompany the petition.

85. No _____ fee shall be charged or collected for the Super Excellent Master Degree.

86. The return to a candidate, before or after receiving the degrees, of any part of the fee, or any donation by a Constituent Council for the purpose of conferring the degrees, either gratuitously or for a less sum than that prescribed in the By-Laws of the Council, _____

87. A Royal Arch Mason who has received the degrees of Royal Master and Select Master in a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in a Jurisdiction exercising control over these degrees, must _____ for and receive the degrees in a regular Council of Royal and Select Masters, paying the fees prescribed therefore, before he can be eligible to sit in a Council of Royal and Select Masters or be eligible to receive the degree of Super Excellent Master or to sit in a Council of that degree in Ohio.

88. (This question has been deleted because of a Code change.)

89. No Council shall receive the petition of a candidate for the degrees who is not in good standing in _____

90. The Council may receive and act upon the petition of a Master Mason in good standing who has regularly petitioned a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, but _____ the Council degrees upon said petitioner unless he shall have received within six months from the date of his Council petition the Royal Arch Degree .

91. No Constituent Council shall receive the petition of a Companion who has been rejected by another Council within _____ after such rejection without the unanimous consent of the Council which rejected him.

92. The objection and the date thereof shall be entered on the minutes of the Assembly at which time it is made, without _____ of the objecting Companion.

93. An objecting Companion shall not be questioned as to his reasons for objecting, but _____ state them, either orally or in writing, to the Council, at any Stated Assembly thereof.

94. The Council is not bound to commit itself to the reasons assigned by the member, but may judge of _____ of any and all reasons so assigned.

95. If, in its opinion, the same are insufficient, the Council may, by a _____ vote of all present except the objector, taken as the presiding officer may direct, overrule the objection and proceed to confer the degrees upon such candidate.

96. A Council shall not receive the petition for membership of a demitted Companion who is not an active member in good standing in _____.

97. Membership in a Council is voluntary. A member in good standing and not in arrears for dues nor under or subject to charges of unmasonic conduct, may petition for and _____, and until he again affiliates, he voluntarily renounces all claims to the benefits of Cryptic Freemasonry.

98. An application for a demit must be made by the member desiring it, either orally in open Council at a Stated Assembly, or _____, duly signed by the applicant and presented at a Stated Assembly, and shall be entered in the minutes.

99. When a demit has been issued and lost, the Companion shall not be entitled to receive a _____, but the Recorder of the Council issuing the demit shall, upon request of such Companion, issue to him a certificate, under seal of the Council, showing that such demit had been issued.

100. The minutes of a Constituent Council shall follow a form approved by the _____, and the names and official titles of the officers (either actual or pro tem) present at each Assembly, also the names of distinguished Companions, visitors and members in attendance, should appear therein.

101. At each Stated Assembly of a Constituent Council within this Jurisdiction, the minutes of the preceding Stated and intervening Special Assemblies must be read and approved _____, signed by the presiding officer and duly attested by the Recorder.

102. A Companion under suspension for non-payment of dues may, at any time before an entry of indefinite suspension for non-payment of dues has been ordered against him, restore himself to good standing without further action by the Council, by payment of all delinquent dues, plus the _____ and such an additional amount, not exceeding fifty cents as the Council may fix by its By-Laws.

103. On proper petition by the suspended Companion, presented at a Stated Assembly and laid over for action at the next or a subsequent Stated Assembly, indefinite suspension for unmasonic conduct may be removed at the pleasure of the Council pronouncing the sentence by a _____ vote, by ballot, of the members present.

104. A Select Master indefinitely suspended by his Lodge or Chapter for non-payment of dues, or either definitely or indefinitely for unmasonic conduct, is thereby suspended from all rights and benefits of Council membership until he shall be restored or reinstated by the _____ which suspended him.

105. Any Council which, by reason of local conditions, is unable to confer the degree, may arrange to have officers and Companions come _____ to assist it to confer the degree.

106. With the approval of the _____, the degree of Super Excellent Master may be conferred by two or more Councils forming a composite cast.

107. Each participating Council will receive credit for conferring the degree if _____ members of that Council, including three officers, are in attendance.

108. The ritual of the Order of the Silver Trowel, conferred under the auspices of the _____, successor to the Thrice Illustrious Master Degree, portrays a lesson of importance to presiding and past presiding officers of Constituent Councils, and unless otherwise provided by this Grand Council, Masters and Past Masters of Constituent Councils may hold membership in the Order.

109. The Distinguished Achievement Award may be presented annually to _____ Ohio Companion who has demonstrated distinguished service to the Cryptic Rite in Ohio.

110. Each recipient of the Distinguished Achievement Award shall be recognized at all Council Assemblies with the _____.

111. Disciplinary Regulations for the handling of charges of unmasonic conduct of a companion are found where in the Code of The Grand Council of Royal and Select Masons of the State of Ohio? Page _____ through Page _____.
